RUTH and STEVE will take focus workshop attendees on a journey through the Scots-Irish Celtic origins of music in Appalachia, through the old-time string band tradition of the late 1800s and the early 1900s, on to the varied styles of current-day Appalachian music. Learn some Celtic tunes and some traditional Appalachian tunes and songs. Besides wonderful melodies, hammered dulcimer players will get to work on some backup, too!

Ruth and Steve, from the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina, play and sing a unique blend of Appalachian Americana music with Celtic roots featuring hammered dulcimer, mountain dulcimer, guitar, vocals and old-time banjo. Ruth teaches hammered and Appalachian mountain dulcimer workshops at festivals throughout the country and is well known for her expressive touch, textured arrangements and sensitive compositions. Steve, an ASCAP award-winning songwriter, has a Master's degree in Appalachian Studies and teaches workshops nationally on guitar, banjo, ukulele, recording, songwriting, sound, and performing.
