Saturday afternoon jams feature playing circles/ jams for both hammered dulcimers and fretted dulcimers as well as a finale all instrument Community Jam.

The ticketed online Concert at 6 to 8 PM Pacific Time is also open to the public and will include the festival headliners, Tina Bergmann, hammered dulcimer, with Bryan Thomas on bass, and Neal Hellman, on mountain dulcimer.
